Robin Hood Festival Celebrates 60th Anniversary

With a theme of "Once Upon a Time in Sherwood", this year's Robin Hood Festival promises to be a special celebration of a cherished tradition with over 60 years of history. Both medieval and modern, the Festival will fill the streets of Old Town Sherwood on July 18-19. One of the most unique sporting events in Oregon, the 59th annual International Archery Tournament with Nottingham, England will take place at Edy Ridge Elementary School on July 19-20.



Visiting archers from Nottingham will be welcomed by the city and knighted on Friday, July 18 at 6:00 pm, with several members of the Sherwood community to be recognized in the annual knighting ceremony.

Enjoy wandering through a village of 100+ vendors Friday night and all day Saturday.

The popular community parade will take place on Saturday, July 19 at 10:00 am. This is a perfect opportunity to show your community spirit with creative entries commemorating "Once Upon a Time in Sherwood". Now is also the perfect time to begin thinking about entries to the castle building and flower contests, with categories for all ages.

Entertainment on the Main Stage will feature popular musical groups including Hit Machine will be performing both Friday and Saturday nights. The Family Stage will highlight local groups and entertainers of all kinds Friday and Saturday, with "Beauty and the Beast" being performed by Voices for the Performing Arts on a third stage Friday and Saturday nights.

This is also the 60th anniversary of the official Maid Marian Court (with origins even before the Festival began). Commemorative events are planned to honor early members of the court and the original Robin Hood and his Merry Men, a philanthropic group that got started just after World War II. INTERESTED IN WATER QUALITY INFORMATION?

Safe, reliable water is a basic life necessity. The City of Sherwood is proud to deliver water to more than 18,575 people every day. We think it is important for our customers to understand where their water comes from, how safe it is, and what actions we take to ensure its continuing safety.

Every year the Water Department publishes a Consumer Confidence Report, also known as the Water Quality Report. Last year, the Environmental Protection Agency changed its requirement for water providers regarding how to distribute this information to their customers. Whereas in years past we have mailed a copy to each and every address in our district, this year we are going green and making the entire report available online.

Please visit www.sherwoodoregon.gov/utilitybilling to access the 2013 Water Quality Report. The report will inform you about the sources we use for your water and the treatment the water undergoes to

ensure it is safe, tastes great and exceptionally clean. Learn about the many activities the water department performs and the award the City has received for the efforts. The City's water supplies are tested for more than 200 contaminants and you can read about those that were detected in 2013.

Also, at the utility billing website you can learn about effective conservation both inside and outside the home, go green with online tools to manage your utility account, and discover more about the services the City's Public Works Department does for you.

Obeying Leash & Scoop Laws

Leashed dogs are welcome visitors in all Sherwood parks, trails, sidewalks, and all other public areas. Dog owners help keep public areas fun and healthy for all visitors by obeying leash and scoop law and complying with all City of Sherwood Ordinances and park rules.

By City of Sherwood Ordinance, dogs must always be on leash. No dogs, on or off-leash, are allowed on fields designated for sport activities.

The law also requires that pet waste must be picked up and disposed of in a trash can. Scoop bags are supplied in most parks. In other public areas, no bags are supplied, so please bring bags with you.

6.04.020 Animal public nuisance prohibited

Noise Disturbance - It is unlawful for the keeper of any dog to permit any sound produced by the dog which annoys, disturbs, injures or endangers the comfort, repose, health, peace, or safety of others.

Animal Waste - It is unlawful for the keeper of any dog to permit the dog to defecate upon public property or upon the private property of another,

unless the person immediately removes the feces and properly disposes of it.

Harassing other animals - It is unlawful for the keeper of any dog to permit the dog to chase or bite another animal, provided the chasing or biting occurs off or outside the premise of the keeper.

Penalty - Violations of this section shall be classified as a Class C violation punishable by up to a \$250.00 fine.

6.04.030 Dog running at large prohibited

It is unlawful for the keeper of any dog to permit the dog to run at large.

Penalty - Violations of this section shall be classified as a Class C violation punishable by up to a \$250.00 fine.

6.04.040 Dogs prohibited from athletic fields

It is unlawful for the keeper of any dog to permit the dog to be on or about any athletic fields.

Penalty - Violations of this section shall be classified as a Class C violation punishable by up to a \$150.00 fine.

SW Langer Farms Parkway Opening Soon!

Curious about the extension of SW Langer Farms Parkway between Tualatin-Sherwood Road and SW Pacific Highway near Home Depot? Construction is nearing completion with final agency inspections occurring in June. Once the project has been inspected and accepted by the City, Washington County and ODOT, the road will be opened to traffic. This is expected to occur by the end of June. The project has been identified in the City's Transportation System Plan (TSP) for many years and is being constructed by Gramor Development as part of the Parkway Village commercial development south of Tualatin-Sherwood Road. The road will provide a new route around the intersection of SW Pacific Highway and SW Tualatin-Sherwood Road. PLANNING NEWS

The ABC's of Zoning

Have you ever noticed that in many cities, like Sherwood, homes are clustered together in certain areas while businesses are clustered together in another? These different areas are called zones. Zones are important because they determine how different spaces can be used. Zoning consists of regulations that control how big of a building you can build on a property and what you can do inside it. City planners work with engineers, architects and developers to create and plan buildings that follow the rules for each zone. The intent is to limit uses that are not compatible from locating near each other, for example a factory next to a housing complex; while allowing compatible uses to locate near each other, like a restaurant and a movie theater.

City planning through the use of zoning has been around since ancient times. When planning a city, planners must consider many factors, including the economy, the environment, and cultural and transportation needs. These are some of the factors used when planning Concept Plans such as the Brookman Area, Adams Avenue North, or the Tonquin Employment Area.

Within the City there are four basic zone categories, and multiple districts within each category; Residential, Commercial, Industrial and Institutional/ Public. Looking at the City's zoning map you will notice that there are more than four colors indicating the zoning districts. Each district has its own color and purpose. For example the commercial zones can be General Commercial, Retail Commercial, Office Commercial, or Neighborhood Commercial and are represented by a shade of red. Each district has different allowed uses.


Below is a breakdown that shows what districts are in which category. For details regarding each such as setbacks from property lines, allowed heights, and the types of uses that can be built in them, please refer to Chapter 16, in Division II of the Sherwood Municipal code at www.sherwoodoregon.gov/planning or feel free to call the Planning Department at 503.925.2308.

Residential: VLDR - Very Low Density Residential, LDR - Low Density Residential, MDRL - Medium Density Residential Low, MDRH - Medium Density Residential High, HDR - High Density Residential

Commercial: GC - General Commercial, RC - Retail Commercial, OC - Office Commercial, NC - Neighborhood Commercial

Industrial: LI - Light Industrial, GI - General Industrial, EI - Employment Industrial

Institutional/ Public: The IP zoning district provides for major institutional and governmental activities such as schools, public parks, churches, government offices, utility structures, and other similar public uses.

November Election Information for Local Candidates

The State of Oregon has declared June 4, 2014 as the date candidates may begin filing for the November 4, 2014 election. Our local ballot will include candidates for Mayor and three City Council seats. According to preliminary election results from Washington County, it appears that Ballot Measure 34-212 passed and councilors will no longer be elected by positions, rather the individuals receiving the most votes would be elected to fill open city councilor seats. Prospective mayoral candidates may begin filing immediately, however the City Council is still waiting for the official election results that will need to be adopted and certified by the City Council in order to officially eliminate the City Council positions. A candidate packet is available at City Hall or check out the materials on the city website.

To be eligible to run for election, a candidate is required to be a registered voter, at least 18 years of age, and a Sherwood resident for at least 12 months. Interested persons must file for candidacy by submitting a City Declaration of Candidacy form, a State of Oregon Candidate Filing Form SEL 101, and by paying a \$10

filing fee or in lieu of the filing fee, submitting a petition for candidacy signed by 20 registered Sherwood voters. The required petition forms are available at the State of Oregon Elections Division.

The Mayor's term is a two year term and City Councilor terms are a four year term. Those elected will serve upon taking an Oath of Office generally scheduled for the 1st City Council meeting in the calendar year.
