Amend your soil

Now is a great time to spread compost. While the City of Sherwood will have soil dropped off at each of the gardens in April, it's always a good idea to supplement that with some good quality compost. Check your local landscape supplier for options or bring your own from your backyard compost bin.



Plant!
