

## **RESOLUTION 2017-049**

# TRANSFERRING BUDGET EXPENDITURE APPROPRIATIONS BETWEEN CATEGORIES FOR FISCAL YEAR 2016-17

**WHEREAS,** on June 21, 2016, the City of Sherwood budget for fiscal year 2016-17 was adopted and funds were appropriated by the City Council; and

**WHEREAS,** on February 7, 2017, the City of Sherwood budget for fiscal year 2016-17 was amended through a budget transfer via Resolution 2017-007; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to ORS 294.463, Oregon Municipalities can transfer appropriation between existing categories during the budget year; and

**WHEREAS**, the following unplanned events and corrections of clerical errors have occurred during the course of this budget year:

#### General Fund (Administration)

- An unanticipated increase in health insurance costs occurred due to a qualifying event for an employee outside of open enrollment.
- An increase in the City Manager's pay was approved on December 20, 2016.
- Pay for several employees was incorrectly budgeted.
- The financial software implementation required more consultant time than anticipated.
- Increase in cost of the Financial Transparency software OpenGov
- The services of an interim Finance Director were required for several months at the beginning of the fiscal year.

## General Fund (Debt Service)

The debt service payment on long term debt was incorrectly budgeted.

## General Fund (Community Services)

• Unanticipated additional funds were received from Washington County Cooperative Library Services.

## General Fund (Community Development)

Engineering Overhead reimbursement was incorrectly budgeted and was overestimated.

General Fund (Fleet Services) and Street Operations, Water, Sanitary, and Stormwater Funds

 During the course of the audit which was completed in December 2016, the accounting for fleet services was questioned and a change in the methodology used to allocate the costs of Fleet Services was requested.

## NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY OF SHERWOOD RESOLVES AS FOLLOWS:
