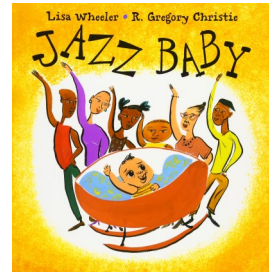

Library programs like storytime can be considered a child's first class. Encouraging the actions and the interactions with the group leader helps your child develop a positive attitude toward learning.

Jeremiah Blow the Fire

Jeremiah blow the fire,

(*blow gently on child*)

(*raspberry!*)



Johnny Whoops

Johnny, Johnny, Johnny, Johnny,
(*Hold out a hand. Using the other, start at little finger and tap each in turn towards thumb, saying the name each time.*)
Whoops Johnny,
(*On "whoops", slide down index finger, then tap thumb.*)
Whoops Johnny,
(*Slide down thumb, up index, tap index*)
Johnny, Johnny, Johnny.
(*Repeat back in opposite direction, to end with the little finger you began on.*)



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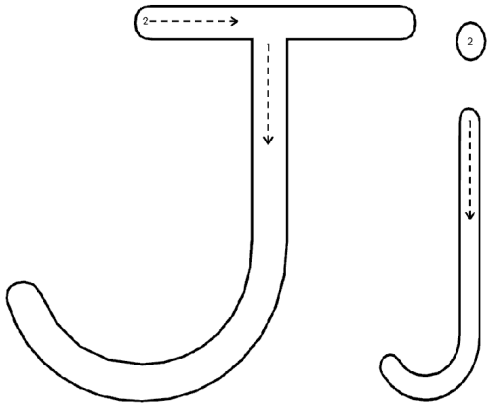
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Play
