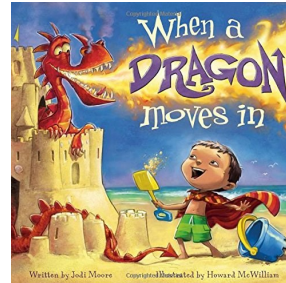

## Talk

Using concept words with your children helps to expand their vocabulary. To be successful readers, children need a large vocabulary. Concept words show relationships between things. For example ice is cold, fire is hot, cold and hot are opposites. Ice, cold, fire, hot, opposites, are all vocabulary to a preschooler.

## Sing

### Ten Wild Horses

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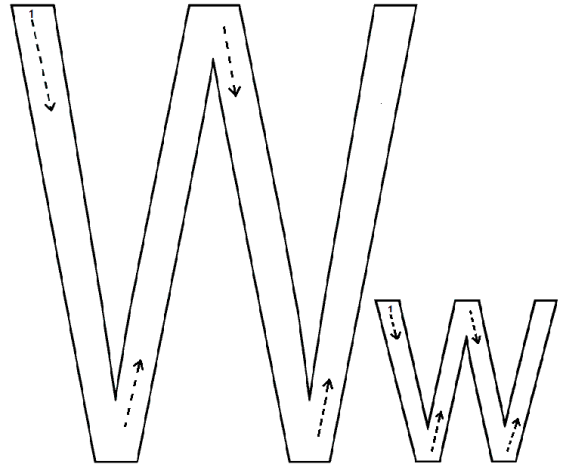
