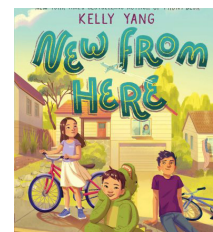

Celebrate International Games Month with a race! We are "old-school-ing" it on the Wii. The console might be different, but the game is the same. Registration required. Ages 8 and up.

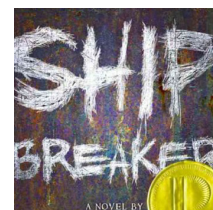
