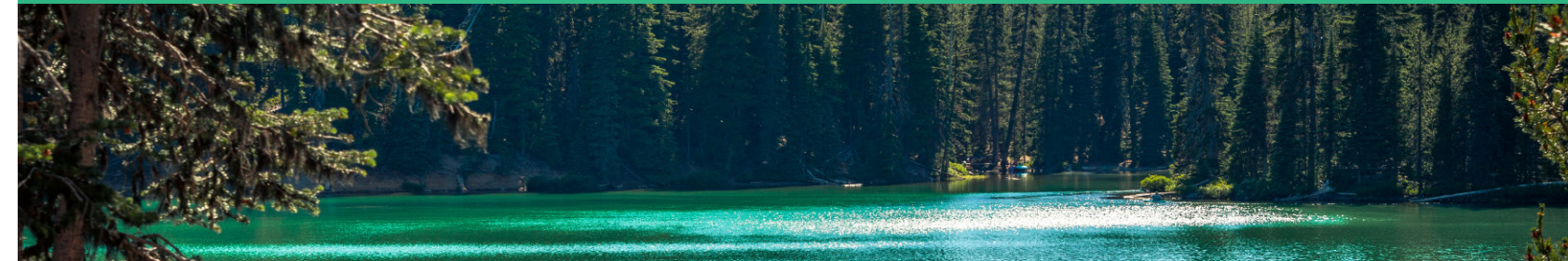

This Incredible Idioms show has magic, comedy, cowboy tricks, hand shadows, and much more!. [CS]

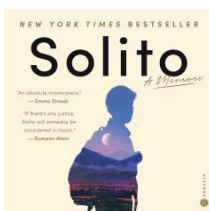
Rhys Thomas, Jugglemania

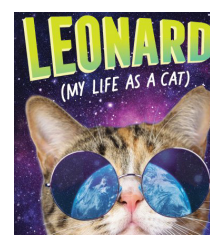


Adult Book Discussion

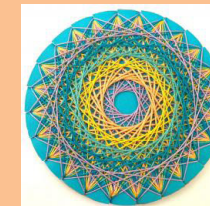
Youth Summer Reading

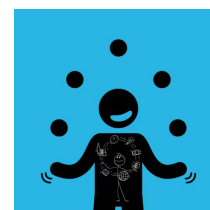
Book Buddies
