3. Project Overview

Jerry Johnson with Johnson Economics provided a presentation and discussed the roles and responsibilities of a TAC member (see record, Exhibit A). He explained what an Economic Opportunities Analysis (EOA) is and the economic goals.

Economic Development Manager Bruce Coleman provided an overview of the economic development goals and activities. He stated economic development is one of the City Council's highest priorities and explained the reasons for Sherwood's economic development focus. He discussed how the City works to facilitate economic development and said the focus is on both traded-sector and local sector business growth. He provided Sherwood's economic development initiative strategies and key target industries.

Mr. Coleman discussed the Tonquin Employment Area (TEA) and said it includes the Trammell Crow project, the Willamette Water Supply project, Schnitzer Properties Sherwood Commerce Center, Kerr

Industrial Site, and Oregon Street Business Park. He said there are other TEA opportunities, such as Dahlke Lane Corridor, and other Sherwood East Industrial projects.

Planning Manager Erika Palmer discussed Sherwood West which is 1,291 acres in Urban Reserve and said this is the next planned area for development in Sherwood. She said the original/current Sherwood West Preliminary Concept Plan was completed in 2016 and proposed primarily residential neighborhoods. The City is currently doing a relook at Sherwood West and explained the process and what is driving the effort.

Mr. Coleman discussed other City economic development initiatives including existing business retention and expansion and business recruitment.

4. Sherwood UGB Data Analysis


Mr. Johnson discussed trends and said there have been two quarters of negative growth. He commented on the consumer price index, employment growth by sector, E-commerce as a percent of all retail trade, net change in employment, relative employment change, employment since the pandemic, and net change in employment in Washington County. He discussed the employment and payroll by sector in the Sherwood Urban Growth Boundary (UGB). He provided information on the net inflow and outflow of employees and said 9,202 commute out of Sherwood. He said in the next meeting they will identify target industries. Discussion followed.

5. Discuss Statement of Community Economic Development Objectives

Mr. Coleman said the current EOA does not reflect the City Council goals. He noted the 2040 Sherwood Comprehensive Plan Economic Development Vision: Thriving and Diversified Economy states, "In 2040, the Sherwood economy has grown to include a variety of businesses big and small that offer stable employment opportunities, higher-wage jobs, and balance the tax base to protect and maintain Sherwood's quality of life. Sherwood provides great destinations and experiences for both residents and visitors." He provided the Comprehensive Plan economical development issues and goals and key policies. Discussion followed.

6. Next Steps

Mr. Coleman suggested options for the next meeting. He offered to send out a doodle pole. Mr. Johnson said the goal is to finish the EOA by the end of the year and have a few more meetings. Ms. Palmer discussed the public engagement component and said the meetings will be open for public comments and live streamed.
