The Library welcomed 320 new library card holders this quarter, 13% more cards than the same quarter last FY. We welcomed nearly 60,000 visits this quarter, an average of 688 per day and an increase of 6% compared to last year.

Libraries help bridge the digital divide. Our public computers were used nearly 3,500 times this quarter.

Total number of sessions increased 15% this quarter compared to last year and the total time our public computers were used went up 22%. Nearly 6 out of every 100 visitors used a public computer this year to date.

Library patrons have access to 1.6 million items countywide. **Total items added to the collection this year to date is 3,745**. This includes our newest collections: Library of Things and electronic games.

Total circulation increased 7.4% this quarter compared to last year, at 90,465 total checkouts this quarter, with an estimated value of nearly \$2,000,000.

Digital checkouts rose 56% and account for 14% of all checkouts. This year to date, physical checkouts rose 2.5% and total circulation is up nearly 7%.



### Other Activities

- Grant success--We were awarded a grant through the Cultural Coalition of Washington County for \$1190. Cultural Coalition of Washington County is funded by the Oregon Trust and donations.
   Crystal Garcia, Librarian II (Adult Services) wrote this grant request and made arrangements with our presenters. This grant will pay for:
  - Two ukulele workshops in 2019—one for adults and teens, and another for families. The latter will be a first for us and something we frequently have been asked to provide.
  - Two tenor ukuleles to be added to our Library of Things collection. We currently have soprano ukuleles, which are best for beginners and those with smaller hands.
- Staffing changes--Four part-time Library Assistant positions were made benefitted and union-represented, now at 20-hours each. Our new Librarian I for Adult Services, Adam Lewkowsky, started in November.
- Training--We had a staff in-service day in October and appreciated the time to focus on professional development as a full team. Session topics included our new catalog, pop-up displays, services for the blind, library of things, and more.
- Community--We brought in nearly 600 donated food items from over 50 participants for the three food pantries in Sherwood during our 16<sup>th</sup> Annual Food for Fines.
