Sherwood Public Library has a dedicated budget of \$97,664 just for adding items to the local collection. We purchase books, periodicals, movies, music, books on CD, and other formats for all ages. Six MLIS Librarians on staff all help to select titles based on local interest, reviews, popularity, and to provide a well-rounded collection for our patrons.
