Sherwood Public Library has a dedicated budget of nearly \$98,000 just for adding items to the local collection of books, periodicals, movies, music, books on CD, and other formats for all ages. Six MLIS Librarians select titles based on local interest, reviews, popularity, and to provide a well-rounded collection for our patrons. We implemented new efficiencies this FY and are right on track for spending our materials budget in a timely manner.
