Community Garden Design - Phase I

24 – 20x20 framed beds

10 - 10x20 framed beds

5 - 4x8 raised beds (approx. 3' high)

Sherwood Community Garden Basics

- Open dawn to dusk each day
- Open approximately April to October (weather dependent)
- Gardeners provide their own equipment (hoses, tools, seeds, soil amendments, etc)
- City provides framed beds, raised beds, several hose bibs
- Pesticide-free
- Community Areas

- Picnic tables for community areas
- Community board for community area
- Eagle Scout/Gold Award projects
- Partnering with the Sherwood Public Library, Metro, OSU Master Gardeners for educational classes
- Partnering with local businesses for product/services
- Reserved plots for food banks, lower income, etc.

Hillsboro	In-Ground 20 x 20 - \$60; 15 x 20 - \$50; 10 x 20 - \$40 Raised Bed 4 x 12 - \$30
Lake Oswego	Plot w/ boarder & Raised Beds 10 x 20 - \$55 resident, \$69 non-resident Plot w/ boarder & Raised Beds 20 x 20 - \$80 resident, \$100 non-resident
Wilsonville	In-Ground 10 x 12 - \$22 Raised Bed 4 x 8 - \$25
THPRD	\$35 first plot / \$45 each additional plot (+\$10 out of district) 10×10 ; 12×12 ; 15×15 (a few plots available >10 x 10 = \$25)
