#### **MEETING NOTES**

- 1. Call to Order/Roll Call (Scheirman)
  - The meeting was officially called to order at 7:00 pm.
- 2. Adjustments to the Agenda (Scheirman)
  - None
- 3. Citizen Comment (Scheirman)
  - None
- **4.** Approval of Minutes (Scheirman)
  - Reid motioned to approve the March 2016 minutes. Seconded by Kneifel. All in favor; motion passed.
- **5.** Community Gardens (Steffens)
  - Steffens presented a Power Point Presentation (see Exhibit A)
  - It was asked if there will be storage for gardeners. Steffens stated that there will not be in phase one, but that it is a possibility for phase two.
  - It was asked what the plot lease term in. Steffens stated that for 2016 it will be May-November, but in futures year it will be March-November.

- It was asked how many plots have been reserved. Steffens answered that there as been 7 applications turned in for all different plot sizes.
- It was asked how much revenue will be brought in from the community garden. Steffens stated that the numbers are changing every day and that will depend on water usage.
- It was asked where water will be located for gardeners. Steffens stated that there will be multiple locations; never more than one plot away.
- It was asked if there will be a fence built around the garden. Steffens explained that there will be a 5-6' fence around the property with 3 entrances that will not be locked.
- It was asked if gardeners will be required to clean their plots at the end of the season. Steffens confirmed that they will.
- **6.** Public Works/Maintenance Projects 2016/17 (Switzer for Sheldon)
  - 2016/17 projects, if proposed budget gets approved, are as follows:
    - o Infill football field at High School
    - o Infill baseball field and soccer fields at Snyder Park
    - Replace turf base cut outs at Snyder Park
    - Repairs to various trails throughout City
    - o Repairs to gravel pathway at Stella Olsen Park
    - o Purchase and install restroom at Cannery Square
    - Complete second phase of Community Garden project \*
    - Park Signage project \*
    - o Complete design and construction documents for Skate Park.
    - o Identify location and design second dog park.

#### 7. Woodhaven Park- Phase II (Switzer)

- Switzer informed the board that the project is now out to bid, the pre bid meeting will be on May 6<sup>th</sup>, bid opening on May 20<sup>th</sup> and go to council on June 7<sup>th</sup>.
- It was asked if the sand pit toys will remain at the park during construction. Switzer confirmed that they will remain at the park.
- It was asked if the tree next to the sandpit will be taken down during construction.
  Switzer explained that an arborist report will be done, but it will likely need to come down due to the tree being at the end of its life span. It was suggested that the board look at investing some money in a mature tree to replace it.
- **8.** Cedar Creek Trail Update (Switzer for Miller)
  - The City received Metro's Nature in the Neighborhood Trail Grant for \$68,045 for the signage for the trail. Including the Washington County Visitor Association Grant, that is nearly \$100,000 for additional Trail amenities! Metro Council is set to award the grant on March 31.

    - Spring basketball teams are spread out in some of the gyms and some clinics going on at SMS.

- Sherwood youth soccer will start their indoor program in April renting the field on Friday nights and Saturdays for just over eight weeks.
