

Q1: Should the City of Sherwood consider additional restrictions on Medical Marijuana Dispensaries? — Yes, Responses Below

Ban the sale of marijuana within city limits.

Place inside a Kaiser or Providence facility.

Do not allow such dispensaries in Sherwood

Don't allow Medical Marijuana dispensaries in Sherwood.


Restrict anything else we can think of.

Should not be around a park, playground, skatepark, basically anywhere that children are





Question 2 is bogus, it assumes we want dispensaries in town. We need a third option, none at all.

Why aren't the regulated like any other pharmacy? Or heck - even like bars and taverns if people are concerned about the impact on kids.

Many medical marijuana users are disabled in some way and may not have access to dispensaries located too far out of town, outside of walking distance, or far from a bus route. While the industrial zones are clearly further from school zones and areas buzzing with public, they may not be ideal or realistic for the patients themselves, who are meant to benefit from a dispensary. Many may have concerns about the general public and having a dispensary in town, but the patients are the ones who will be effected by the location the most. My main concern is that the patients and what they need will not be considered in this decision as much as the general public's opinion. Marijuana has a bad rep, medical or otherwise. It may be beneficial to provide a background on medical marijuana use to educate those who don't know anything further than recreational use and horror stories.

I would prefer medical marijuana remain in Multnomah County.

I do not believe our community needs to support a dispensary

I would like to know how many residents in sherwood and surrounding communities are registered medical marijuana users. Is this really a practical necessity for a small town like Sherwood? In general, I think medical marijuana should be treated like all other regulated and controlled substances used for medicinal purposes - received only by prescription through a pharmacy, regulated by the FDA. While I am in favor of marijuana being used for medicinal purposes, I believe we should do everything we can to protect youth from obtaining marijuana for recreational/illegal uses, and think it should only be found in non- smokable form that makes it less available to those for whom it is not prescribed by a medical doctor.

Should Sherwood allow medical marijuana dispensary? No

I believe that the state has done extensive research into current medical marijuana regulations throughout the Nation; to further impose regulations not only undermines the work the State has already done, but is a redundant and an ill-advised use of city employee hours. I fully understand the necessary discussion regarding the regulations of recreational marijuana retailers, but as the Medical Marijuana program has been active in Oregon since 1997 to impose new regulations at this time seems excessive. The latest figures show the average age of a medical card holder in Oregon to be 53 years old. The most common issue for Oregon card holders is PTSD suffered by Veterans. As discussed on CNN's exposé of the Medical Marijuana industry, one patient stated "if I would have known it would take away the nightmares, I would have been smoking for years". These are the individuals that need to be kept at the forefront of everyone's mind. These individuals are not a common stereotype, they are citizen's (as a SSN is required for a card) who have every right to aspire to achieve the best health possible. The discussion should not be medical marijuana. This is now legalized recreational marijuana sales and use. Also, how does the city of Sherwood plan to override state law?

I don't believe city code should be changed to allow a medical marijuana dispensary to be in an industrial zone. If you do that, then you will need to allow other businesses to locate there as well. The State Law is pretty clear and seems to offer quite a bit of protection and guidelines (1000 feet from school zones, etc). Sherwood shouldn't over regulate on our own. The State mandates how liquor can be sold and that seems to be working well. Marijuana should be regulated in the same manner.

There is no good location for a Medical Marijuana Dispensary in Sherwood, we are too small. I don't want it here, I don't think we need it here, we can't afford it here. We already have enough of an issue with Stella Olsen Park, why invite more in? I already have to pay attention to the conversations my kids hear around town--I overheard two older women talking about who the best growers in the area are when I was in line at the post office. I don't need my kids hearing that kind of thing--this is supposed to be a family-oriented town. It won't be much longer if we don't keep these kinds of things from coming in here.

The Medical Marijuana Dispensaries should be monitored carefully by law enforcement.

Medical marijuana should be treated and dispensed in the same manner as other prescription medication. No exceptions or exemptions should be placed upon the sale of medical marijuana that do not also exist for other pharmaceutical medications.

I want to know that the people that passed this law are also going to pay for rehab and problems caused by this law

No concerns. Keeping either/both recreational or medical marijuana dispensaries in a "grey market economy" makes medical marijuana dispensaries venerable to poor treatment by landlords, inaccessible to consumers who need them for medical reasons, and makes oversight more difficult.
