# Proposed Measure 34-345 for Countywide Library Services

Washington County Cooperative Library Services (WCCLS) is the primary source of funding for public library operations across the county.

This November, voters will have the opportunity to consider a proposed measure that would fund public library services in Washington County. If passed, Measure 34-345 would replace a 5-year levy expiring in June 2026 and continue to generate tax revenue from July 2026 through June 2031. The proposed measure would cost property owners \$0.37 per \$1,000 of assessed property value.

If Measure 34-345 does not pass, library services would not be provided as proposed and property taxes would not be increased. Read more at wccls.org/levy. Sherwood Public Library funding comes from WCCLS through the county's general fund (40%) and the levy (26%), as well as the City of Sherwood general fund (34%).


